<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Per capita income for Blacks in San Francisco is 56% less that of whites. At 10.4%, the unemployment rate of Blacks in San Francisco is the highest in the city and is over three times that of whites. Black owned businesses (those registered with SBA) comprise about 4% of all small businesses in San Francisco. There are approximately 41.67% fewer African American owned businesses certified in 2007 compared to 2004. Nearly 35% of all African American in the workforce are in Professional in Management & Professional Occupations (MSA 2000) Technology, retail, healthcare, and construction are projected to see high rates of growth in San Francisco.

HOUSING KEY DATA POINTS

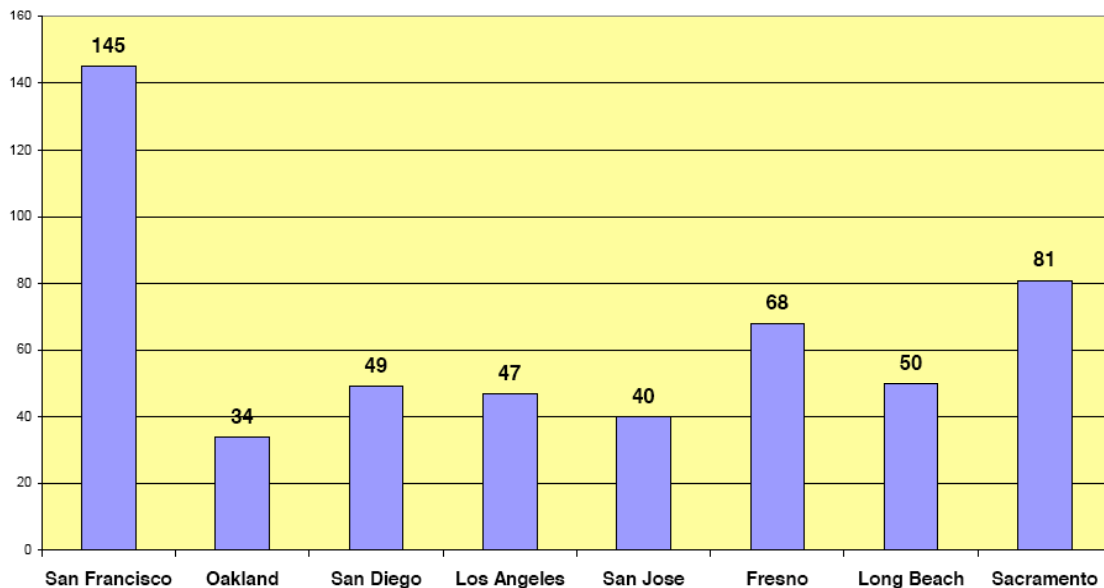
1. Approximately 65% of Blacks in San Francisco are renters.
2. Homeowners living in San Francisco for 20 years are more are less likely than newer homeowners to move.
3. The mortgage rejection rate was nearly 1 in every three for African Americans in San Francisco.
4. 19% of the sub-prime loans went to African Americans in San Francisco

1. At nearly 14%, the felony arrest rate for African Americans in San Francisco is the highest in the State of California.
2. African Americans in San Francisco are arrested at more than twice the rate of all other racial groups combined.
3. The adolescent homicide rate for African Americans is the highest in San Francisco.

EDUCATION KEY DATA POINTS

1. Slightly more than half of African Americans 25 and older in San Francisco have attended some college.
2. Only 26% of all African American students completed required courses for entrance into CSU or UC systems as opposed to 65% for Asians and 58% for whites.
3. The one year high school drop out rate was highest among African American students at 6.1%.

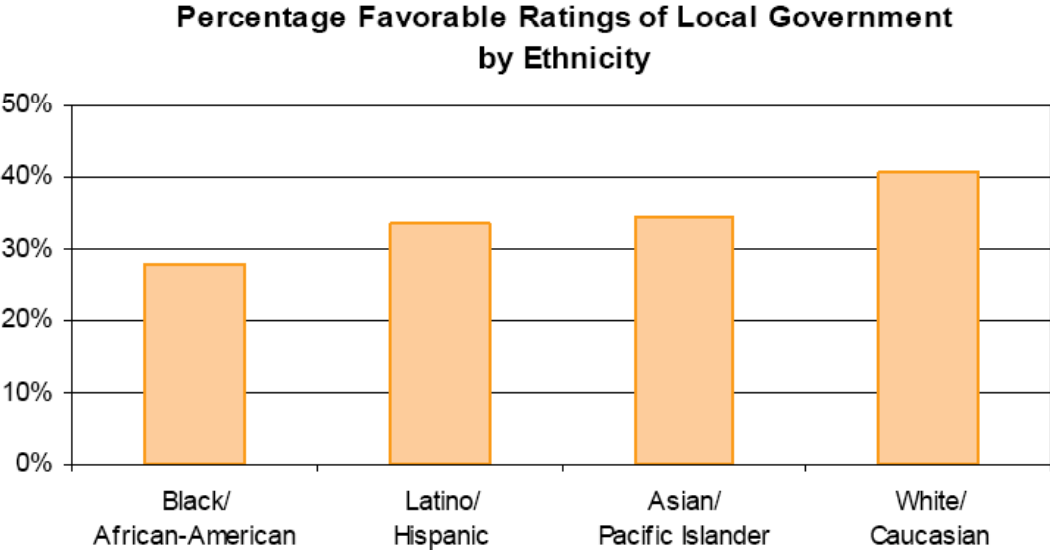

SOCIAL & CULTURAL KEY DATA POINTS

- Only 28% of African-Americans give high marks to San Francisco’s local government compared to about a third of both Asian/Pacific Islander and Latino/Hispanic respondents, and 41% of white responded.
- African Americans comprise the largest percentage of population in the Armed Services.
